

Information on Video Surveillance pursuant to Article 13 GDPR

2. Purpose of Processing and Legal Basis

Video surveillance is carried out in the entrance, access road and courtyard areas at the two sliding gates for the purpose of protecting property (preventing, deterring and investigating burglary, theft and vandalism) as well as exercising our property rights by monitoring authorised access and preventing unauthorised entry.

The legal basis for the processing is our legitimate interest pursuant to Article 6(1)(f) GDPR. Our legitimate interest in safeguarding the company premises, buildings and business assets outweighs the interests or fundamental rights and freedoms of the data subjects.

The area covered by the cameras is strictly limited to the access points. There is no continuous monitoring of workplaces or surveillance of employees' conduct. Public areas beyond the property boundaries are completely excluded from recording by means of technical privacy masking.

3. Recipients of Personal Data

The recordings are treated as strictly confidential. Access to the recorded images is restricted exclusively to the company's management and authorised personnel who are subject to confidentiality obligations (e.g. the Head of Internal IT).

Personal data will only be disclosed to third parties, in particular law enforcement authorities and courts, where this is necessary in a specific case for the investigation of criminal offences or the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.

No personal data will be transferred to countries outside the European Union (EU).

4. Retention Period

The recorded images are automatically overwritten by the system within a maximum of 48 hours as part of a rolling recording cycle and are thereby permanently deleted.

Longer retention will only take place where the recordings are required as evidence in connection with specific criminal offences or for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims. In such cases, the data will be deleted once the relevant proceedings have been concluded.

5. Your Rights as a Data Subject

Under the GDPR, you have the following rights:

- **Right of access (Article 15 GDPR):** You may request confirmation as to whether you are being recorded and, where applicable, to obtain a copy of the relevant video footage, provided that this does not adversely affect the rights and freedoms of others.
- **Right to erasure (Article 17 GDPR):** You may request the deletion of your personal data where the statutory requirements are met.
- **Right to restriction of processing (Article 18 GDPR):** Under certain circumstances, you may request the restriction of the processing of your personal data.
- **Right to object (Article 21 GDPR):** You have the right to object, on grounds relating to your particular situation, at any time to the processing of your personal data based on Article 6(1)(f) GDPR.

6. Right to Lodge a Complaint with a Supervisory Authority

If you believe that the processing of your personal data infringes the GDPR, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority. The competent supervisory authority for our organisation is:
